

Report from the Nordic Collaboration group on LUTD

Despite the pandemic, the Nordic LUTD group has been very active since NUF2019. We started out 2020 with the 5th LUTD course in Copenhagen, focusing on late effects after cancer treatment (*'The price of the cure'*), an increasing role for urologists. The course was so successful that we decided to do something similar for our symposium at NUF2021, which unfortunately was postponed to 2022. We have had many Zoom meetings through the last couple of years, planning both the symposium and our next course, which finally will take place in Stockholm September 2022. This course is titled *'Lower urinary tract disorders: Idiopathic or neurogenic – does it matter?'* It has a very ambitious two-day program with focus on LUTD/NLUTD work up and differential diagnosis, pitfalls and the wide range of treatment options, with lecturers from all the Nordic countries.

At our group meeting at NUF2022 in Helsinki we laid out the plans for the future, including finalising the plans for the 6th LUTD course in Stockholm, starting to plan the symposium for NUF2023 in Bergen as well as collaborative multicenter research projects.

We have previously been active in developing the NUF exchange program/observerships and still promote and encourage colleagues to take advantage of that opportunity.
